## Central Oregon Fire Chiefs Announce Seasonal Burning Closing at Sunset on May 31

"The Central Oregon Fire Chiefs Association (COFCA) announces the date of closing for residential and private lands open debris burning across the tri-county region in Deschutes, Crook and Jefferson Counties. Burning debris piles on private lands in much of central Oregon will not be allowed starting at sunrise on June 1 this year as the area heads into the summer wildland fire season."

## Burn Barrels

Burning in an approved burn barrel is allowed between dawn and 10am with a permit. Materials permitted for a burn barrel: Cardboard, Paper, Small Limbs, and Dry Leaves. Prohibited materials all types of burning: Garbage, Plastic, Diapers, Wire, Insulation, Auto Bodies, Asphalt, Waste Oils, Rubber, Dead Animals, Food Service, Commercial and Industrial Wastes. CULVER CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
May 20, 2019  
City of Culver Council Chambers

Workshop: Mr. Jeff Rasmussen, Jefferson County Administrator and Commissioner Wayne Fording attended the meeting and presented information on a proposal for the city to take ownership of Iris Lane for the area within the Culver city limits. He outlined the benefits and process which would need to be followed. The council and county agreed to look into it further and proceed with doing the appropriate due diligence. Councilor Carpenter suggested the city reconsider the lunch cost increase by dropping the price \$.50 to an even \$5.00 per meal. Fee changes require a public hearing and the council directed it be included on the June agenda.

City Council Meeting - 6:30 p.m.

Roll Call: Mayor Diaz and Councilors Middleton, Carpenter, Orr, Diaz and Byrd were present. Councilor Larson was absent. Consent Agenda: The consent agenda was amended to remove a bill from Stan Suenaga as he will no longer be the code enforcement officer and withdrew his bill. With the change, the consent agenda passed unanimously. Citizen Input, & Public Comments: Youth advisory group: Felicia Bevoir reported the Youth group would like to be in charge of the games for the Crawdad Festival. Ginger Gann expressed concern about closing the grass pile and the lack of available options. Old Business: Stormwater project: The council unanimously awarded the bid for the construction of the stormwater project (pending no appeals are received) and authorized the Mayor to sign and bind the city. Sewer Service to Iris/Hwy 361/Elbe intersection: Troy Baker with Anderson Perry Engineering explained the normal developer/city responsibilities and process. The potential options for providing services to the area were discussed and the council authorized up to \$3,000 for a memo to outline the options and emphasized they do not want the project to interfere with the stormwater project. He also reported the Lift Station project will be presented at the meeting in June. Ratify Actions: The council ratified actions including: Agreement with Dept. of Corrections increasing meal cost; Easement with Culver School District for the stormwater project; Accept donation of two laptop computers from CIS; and the Scope of Work and contract with Anderson Perry for the lift station project was approved. New Business: The Iris Lane ownership discussion was tabled pending further discussions and the Irrigation Water discussion was also tabled. Staff Reports: Patti Carpenter reported on the Chamber of Commerce meeting and updated the council on their activities as well as reported on what is happening in Jefferson County. Jack Ickler reported on the water meeting he attended. Kim Symons reported: 1) She is working with the engineers on the lift station project. 2) Flooding from irrigation water has occurred twice in a week and she is working with others to resolve the problems. 3) Effluent irrigation has started and they expect to be empty by August. The need for an additional irrigation pump is being evaluated. 4) She is in the process of getting the splash pad up and running, a new pump was required. 5) The grass pile has been leveled and the area blocked off. 6) The county will start work on the chip sealing project and 10th Ave. repairs. Discussions are taking place regarding Iris Lane and having the county do some work as well as discussing some cost share options with property owners on 6th Ave. 7) Jefferson County Sheriff's Office donated a pickup to the city and it is working great. Donna McCormack reported: 1) Letters were sent to property owners regarding stormwater ditch changes which occurred on certain properties. 2) For the Park Pavilion Project, the council affirmed they want a "Timber Type" structure. 3) The council decided not to notify the Sheriff's Office of potential changes to the existing service agreement. The council asked about funding and was assured the money planned for the code enforcement could be used for the Sheriff Office. Attorney Report: He reported things are moving along and commended the City Recorder for her work. Council/Mayor Reports: Councilor Diaz reported there are some potholes, and a street sign gone at Center Ridge and Iris. Councilor Middleton expressed concern about solicitors. Mayor Diaz reported: 1) Councilor Larson has agreed to be the wastewater liaison. 2) Councilor Diaz was awarded a 25-yr. pin for service with the JCFD#1. 3) She would like a letter to the farmer about the recent flooding. 4) Other actions included reporting on other entity meetings and indicated she would like to meet with the S.O. to review code enforcement issues.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
