CULVER CITY COUNCIL MEETING

April 16, 2018

City Council Workshop – 6:00 p.m. The council reviewed the Intergovernmental Agreement with Jefferson County for building program services.

City Council Meeting – 6:30 p.m. ROLL CALL & PLEDGE; ACTION ITEMS: Mayor Diaz Councilors Diaz, Rushing, Byrd, and Walker were present. The Consent Agenda was approved.

PRESENTATIONS: Brandon Mahon with Anderson Perry Engineering reported the 30% design for the South Iris Storm Water System is completed and he will move forward on the final design and engineering. He will prepare a work order to be presented to the council. Brandon Mahon presented the preliminary construction cost estimate for an RV Park is approximately \$2 million. That estimate depends upon the materials used and is for construction only. He provided funding information and a summary of the rates that would need to be charged based on the amount needed to build and operate it. The council thanked him for the information and took no action.

CITIZEN'S INPUT: Jerry Shaw, Mike Hardie, Jillian Strodestam, Rachel Sando, Felila Narotski and Brian Chapman all addressed the council explaining their reasons for opposing the idea of an RV Park on the city property. Courtney Snead is running for County Commissioner and she is trying to get around to all the communities and is available to answer any questions.

OLD BUSINESS: Pavilion Park Project: Paul Sumner explained the project has gone through a lot of changes and he proposes a bid document be prepared which would require a sealed bid and have it distributed to all the players. The Mayor, City Recorder and Attorney will work together to develop the bid documents for a pavilion and have responses due in 30 days of it being released. Jefferson County IGA for building services was approved.

NEW BUSINESS: Kim Symons presented information on a grant proposal for a basketball court with the city contributing \$10,000 and the total grant amount would be for \$44,828.08. The city would also provide labor in kind. The court would be a multi-use court with an area for youth basketball and could also be used as a tennis court. The grant request, authorization for the \$10,000 match and authorization to submission of the grant was approved.

STAFF REPORTS: Patti Carpenter was away on vacation but had submitted her report which was in the packet. Chris Funk reported: 1) He has been working on the irrigation culvert that was damaged. 2) The bathrooms are open and the rough plumbing has been completed for the new bathroom, which will be installed this week. 3) Macy Farms are ready to irrigate and the ponds at the treatment plant have plenty of room, they are about 2/3 full. 4) The purchase of a lift gate was approved. 5) A sewer monitoring system was also approved. 6) Last month the city approved the purchase of a fence for the lot for the grass clipping pile. The idea of using cement barriers was discussed as well as limiting commercial businesses and discontinuing the pile. The city will consider ideas on how to handle the grass accumulation, no action was taken. Donna McCormack reported 1) An application for the storm water system was prepared and awaiting letters of support. 2) Attended the COCO meeting and the League of Oregon Cities is trying to encourage partnerships and expand the level of services they provide. 3) She will be on vacation for two weeks.

Paul Sumner no report.

COUNCIL & MAYOR REPORTS: Councilor Rushing attended the fire dept. meeting and the annexation is still being discussed. There is a lot involved in the pavilion project but it will be worked through. Councilor Walker reported he is doing better. Councilor Diaz had no report. Councilor Byrd had no report. Mayor Diaz reported: 1) She will be attending a job fair on May 9th in Culver. 2) There is LOC training in Redmond on the 19th. 3) She asked for Chris to be issued a credit card. 4) The council does listen and the public is invited to always come to the meetings. The newsletter is also available through e-mail.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for May 21, 2018.
